### PASSING OUT PARADE

A colourful parade was held on the occasion of passing out of 12<sup>th</sup> Batch of Constable/Fire on 16.05.2001. A total of 207 firemen took part in the parade after a rigorous 40-week training schedule which included a 18-week module on Industrial Security followed by a mid-term break of 02 weeks and 20-week module on fire training.

The parade was inspected by Shri M Venkaiah Naidu, Minister for Rural Development, Govt. of India. In his address, Shri Naidu stressed upon the need for effective training in Fire prevention, detection and fire fighting. He emphasised that fire safety management is one area where the degree of vulnerability is very high and potential for destruction is immense both in terms of human lives and economic loss. Referring to the fire disasters which took place in ONGC oil wells in Rajahmundry in 1996 and Bharatpur Ordnance Factory in 2000, he hoped that the fire wing of CISF will match with expertise to meet such modern fire risks and that NISA will play a key role in updating and

moulding the fire men suitably to boldly accept the growing professional challenges and come out with flying colours.

The Chief Guest also dwelt upon the plans of hostile forces to create internal and external disturbances by trans-border terrorism in the country through ongoing sustained hostility engineered and fuelled with single minded determination and pursuit of politics of hate and violence. He complimented the role of Armed forces for their courage and valour in guarding our frontiers from external enemies, maintaining internal security and protecting the people from malicious designs of inimical forces.

Welcoming the guests on the occasion Shri P V K Reddy, IPS, DIG/NISA stated that the shifting and amalgamation of Fire Service Training Institute from Deoli (Rajasthan) to NISA complex has added a new dimension to the training being imparted at this institution as the security and fire wings are the

two wheels upon which the organisation must move forward to achieve its mission. The force is acquiring a market driven focus to meet the needs of its client industries with emphasis on cost effectiveness and technological upgradation and, as the premier training institution of this unique organisation, NISA is the nodal center to facilitate this process of change and help the force to re-orient itself. A Commemoration Parade was organised on 14.04.2001 on the occasion of Fire Service Day to pay homage to fire service personnel who laid down their lives while discharging their duties in the service of the Nation. DIG/NISA laid the wreath at "SHAHID SMARAK" during the solemn ceremony organized as a mark of remembrance to the martyrs.

The CISF fire service which was constituted in the year 1969, has witnessed a steady growth and today it provides effective fire protection coverage to 83 PSUs in different sectors.
