ANTI TERRORISM ASSISTANCE –5505 INDIA INTEGRATING COUNTER TERRORISM STRATEGIES PROGRAMME

The ATA-5505 India Integrating Counter Terrorism Strategies Programme for Superintendent of Police to Inspectors General was held at this Academy from 28.11.05 to 16.12.05. A total of 12 officers attended the course in two sessions. The 15-day course is designed to assist the partner nations in developing the framework and functional elements of a National level Counter Terrorism Unit (CTU). It addresses the CTU's mission of identifying, collecting, analyzing and disseminating intelligence information that targets domestic and international terrorism. The course was inaugurated by Shri PVK Reddy, IPS, Director NISA. Addressing the participants, Shri PVK Reddy, IPS, IG/Director, NISA told, "Terrorism continues to be the top concern of law enforcement

agencies all over the world. Incidents like series of bomb blasts in London, Egypt bombings, the bomb blasts in crowded market place in Delhi are grim reminders of the threats that we in law enforcement and security have to face. Terrorists hitherto were using conventional means of attack. But with the advancement in science and technology, they are increasingly gaining access to advanced equipment including nuclear, biological and chemical weapons for achieving their target of maximum number of casualties. International co-operation is one important avenue to be followed in the war against terrorism. It is in this context, the course assumes great significance. This course is designed to assist the partner nations in developing the framework and functional elements of a National Level Counter Terrorism Unit (CTU)". Shri PVK Reddy, IPS, IG/Director NISA valedicted the course on 16-12-2005.

It was also with the view to study the requirements of additional equipments and resources that are to be provided to NISA in order that it function as a well equipped center for excellence in disaster management studies. In his opening address Shri P V K Reddy, IPS, Director NISA explained to the delegates the progress made by NISA in the field DM studies. He also enumerated the steps taken by the Academy to impart training of world standard with equipment of world class to various participants including those from abroad in the field of MFR and CSSR.

The presentation by Director/NISA was followed by address by Gen. N C Vij, Vice Chairman, NDMA. In his address Gen. Vij emphasised greater awareness and concerted efforts in the area of disaster management to counter and mitigate the effects of disaster. Thereafter the members visited FSTI for a live demonstration on MFR, CSSR and NBC. The visit was finally ended with all the members expressing profound appreciation of the high skills and preparedness demonstrated by the participants of MFR, CSSR and NBC demonstrations.

4TH CRITICAL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT COURSE

The 4th Critical Incident Management Course was organized at this Academy from 21.11.05 to 26.11.05. 23 officers of the rank of GOs/SOs of CPOs & State Police attended the course. Shri PVK Reddy, IPS, IG/Director, NISA inaugurated the course. The objective of the course was to describe Critical Management Principles, to understand time sensitive decision-making process, to develop media guidelines, information releases & news briefings and also to develop negotiation skills in critical situation. Addressing the participants Shri PVK Reddy, IPS, IG/Director, NISA told, “ this Academy has successfully replicated the Critical Incident Management Course on the same lines as conducted by Louisiana State Police Academy, Baton Rouge, USA three times in the past. We are also organizing other courses like Crisis Response conducted under the ATA Programmes of the US Government for officers of various Law Enforcement Agencies. The past few months have seen a spurt in attacks on civilian population

in India and abroad. Not only are we responding to these manmade events but also to natural calamities like earthquakes, cyclone, tsunami etc., It is therefore absolutely essential that a systematic response mechanism be developed so that crisis can be overcome in a coordinated and effective manner and with least confusion. Critical Incident Management aims to maximize human survival and preservation of property, minimize danger, and to restore normal operations at the earliest. A crisis may be sudden and unforeseen, or there may be varying periods of warning. The Critical Incident Management process is intended to be sufficiently flexible to accommodate contingencies of all types, magnitudes, and duration. Additionally Critical Incident Management will provide a venue for promptly identifying and supporting key decision makers and improved management of public information.”

The course was valedicted by Shri PVK Reddy, IPS, IG/Director, NISA.

SEMINAR ON INDUSTRIAL SECURITY MANAGEMENT

5th Seminar on Industrial Security Management for DIGs of CPOs was organised at this Academy from 19.12.2005 to 23.12.2005. 16 Officers of the rank of DIG participated in the Seminar. Shri PVK Reddy, IPS, IG/Director, NISA inaugurated the Seminar on 19.12.2005. The main objectives of the seminar were to provide a forum for discussion on security scenario in general and Industrial Security in particular, to identify emerging threats to Industrial Security and understand the Integrated Security System. The major thrust areas of the seminar included; Risk Analysis and Vulnerability Assessment, Nuclear Installation Security, Disaster Management, Aviation Security, Space Installations Security and Profile of a Security Chief in the New Millennium. In his inaugural speech, the Director emphasized that “The Security Seminar for DiG of CPOs and State Police can be envisaged as a course related to the crucial part of national security dealing with industrial and national wealth protection.

He further said, “Vital installations of national importance have always been vulnerable to various security threats – both due to their strategic importance and the adverse publicity they create. Attempts to weaken critical infrastructure are one of the main aims of those who seek to undermine the security capabilities of our nation. It is therefore important that all out efforts be made to preserve these assets in a state of optimum preparedness. The dynamic nature of the prevailing security environment compels all security practitioners to look beyond the conventional arena of industrial security limited by the perimeter of the premises within which they operate. Cyber crimes, industrial espionage are some of the new areas which would require specific attention in future.” The seminar closed on 23.12.05.
